


IRC Mission

The International Rescue Committee responds to the world's worst humanitarian crises, helping to restore health, safety, education, economic wellbeing and power to people whose lives have been devastated by violence, conflict and disaster.



Historic Roots



IRC founded in 1933 in response to those fleeing Nazi Germany

Albert Einstein put forth initial call to action upon which the International Relief Association, now the International Rescue Committee was formed



Where IRC works today





An Internally Displaced Person is...

An internally displaced person (IDP) is a person who has been forced to flee his or her home due to violence, armed conflict or violation of human rights...



But remains in his or her own country and has not crossed an international border.



A Refugee is...

A person who is forced to flee their home, but leaves leave their country and cannot return because of a legitimate fear of persecution based on:



race, religion, nationality, political activity or membership in certain social groups.



An Asylum Seeker is...

A person who fled their home country because of war or other lifethreatening factors, enters another country and applies for asylum, i.e. international protection, in this other country.



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

Our Impact: IRC in San Diego 2019

With the generous support of our donors, partners, volunteers and community, the International Rescue Committee continued to provide targeted and essential services to assist refugees, Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) holders, asylum seekers & asylees, immigrants and low-income families thrive in San Diego.



2,251 PEOPLE RECEIVED HELP WITH IMMIGRATION INCLUDING 236 DACA RENEWALS & 661 NEW CITIZENS



415 people found jobs and 379 earned certificates or credentials. 146 people completed the Vocational ESL \$145

Average increase in monthly net income.

\$525,000 in small business, auto, and credit building loans disbursed to 145 borrowers.

COVID-19 RESPONSE IRC in San Diego

Since going remote on 3/16/2020 through 7/31/2020:



474

Unemployment Insurance & financial relief applications filed



62 Job placements and 615 individuals provided with job search support



689

Small businesses received application support and/or business counseling services



Grant and loan funds secured for 73 small businesses



- Clients served in remote **598** immigration legal service appointments and citizenship instruction classes
- Youth supported through virtual 320 tutoring or mentorships
- Individuals participated in one of 1162 117 virtual trainings
